Dear Friends,

When news of the Hepatitis A outbreaks in Santa Cruz and San Diego were announced at the end of July, The Midnight Mission was proactive in working with the Department of Public Health (DPH) to conduct a vaccination clinic in early August. Last week, at our Annual Health Fair, the DPH was here once again providing vaccinations.

It is important to know that Hepatitis A is preventable and curable. The best way to prevent Hepatitis A is by getting vaccinated. Visit your doctor's office, or call 2-1-1 to find a local clinic or doctor. You can also prevent the spread of Hepatitis A by washing your hands with soap and warm water before eating or preparing food and after using the bathroom and changing diapers.
