Brethren,

Those principles of mutual respect and courtesy were important in building a civilized society, and were extended to many branches of both religious traditions, and out to others. By the practice of masonry among military lodges, the principles were shared with many other countries, and we find freemasonry among many different cultures.

Relief is a tenet that allows us to practice that great moral virtue of treating others as we would ask to be treated, and to show compassion for the victims of bad luck, adversity or persecution.
