First, a heartfelt congratulations to Brother Andrew DeMofonte on receiving his welldeserved Hiram Award. We had a wonderful turnout, and our very own Emerald Star prepared a delicious meal for the event. Thank you to all who came out to support our Brother.

There are a few important matters to address. As of the closing of Grand Lodge in October, everyone's dues were in arrears. This does not mean you did anything wrong or that you will be suspended; it simply means you owe dues. Suspensions are not considered until after two years of nonpayment. If you received a suspension letter and are less than two years in arrears, please disregard that message. We are currently working to catch up with Brothers who have been behind on their dues for more than two years.

Additionally, there was an oversight last year regarding dues not being raised. This resulted in this year's per capita being \$77.50, while lodge dues were only \$75, causing the Lodge to pay \$2.50 for each member, putting us in violation of the Grand Lodge's minimum requirement of \$12 above per capita. At the beginning of the year, we addressed this issue, sent out notices, and after the allotted time, members voted to raise the dues to \$100 for 2025. There was a mix-up between the Lodge and Grand Lodge, with Grand Lodge sending out dues notices for \$75. We apologize for any confusion, but dues are indeed \$100.

The finance committee has reviewed the impact of members not paying their dues for over two years and the failure to raise our dues. The financial loss this year alone is significant. We are not asking for donations; we simply ask that you continue to pay your dues as you have been. We appreciate your payments and support.

We have welcomed new members and seen some familiar faces return to the lodge. It's wonderful to see Brothers we haven't seen in a while, and we appreciate all the help we can get with our officers' line, committees, activities, or mentoring new Brothers. We invite you to join us at any event you can so we can continue our fellowship and grow our membership through active participation and fun.
