

Masonic History in September

The Masonic Cornerstone Laying of the U.S. Capitol (September 18, 1793)

Brother George Washington, the Master of Alexandria Lodge No. 22, led a grand procession in full Masonic regalia to the site of the new U.S. Capitol building. Before a crowd of dignitaries, he conducted a solemn Masonic ceremony to lay the cornerstone of the edifice. This historic event forever linked the Craft with the very foundation of the United States' government and its ideals.

The Chartering of African Lodge #459 (September 20, 1784)

On this date, the Grand Lodge of England issued a warrant to African Lodge #459 in Boston, officially chartering a group of Black Freemasons led by Brother Prince Hall. This was a monumental step forward, granting them the authority to meet as a regular lodge. It laid the groundwork for the establishment of Prince Hall Freemasonry, an enduring and influential branch of the Craft that has championed community and philanthropy for over two centuries.

The Lodge that Initiated George Washington (September 1, 1752)

While not the date of his initiation, September 1st, 1752 marks the establishment of a new lodge at Fredericksburg, Virginia. This lodge, known as Fredericksburg Lodge No. 4, holds the distinct honor of being the fraternity where a young George Washington would soon be initiated into the mysteries of Freemasonry. It represents the early roots of the Craft in the American colonies and its enduring appeal to men of all backgrounds.

Brother Lafayette's Arrival (September 6, 1777)

A young French nobleman and ardent Freemason, the Marquis de Lafayette, arrived in America to volunteer his services for the Revolutionary War. He was quickly given a commission as a Major General and became a trusted confidant and friend to Brother George Washington. His commitment to the ideals of liberty and brotherhood embodied the very spirit of international fraternity.

The Laying of the Cornerstone of the Grand Lodge of California Building (September 12, 1912)

On this date, a grand Masonic ceremony was held to lay the cornerstone of the new Grand Lodge building in San Francisco, a structure that would replace the one lost in the 1906 earthquake. This event marked a triumphant moment of renewal and resilience for Freemasons in California, symbolizing their enduring commitment to the community. The magnificent temple remains a beacon of the Craft and a testament to their perseverance.
