
I look forward to seeing you all at our October Stated Meeting, at Grand Lodge, and at the other events planned this month.

# **Masonic History in October**



October 16, 1646 – Elias Ashmole Initiated This is one of the earliest known records of a speculative (non-operative) Mason. On this date, Elias Ashmole, the noted English antiquarian and philosopher, was initiated in an "occasional" lodge at Warrington, England. His diary entry documenting the event remains a cornerstone of early Masonic history.



# October 5, 1785 – Cornerstone of Masons' Hall, Richmond, Virginia

On this date, Richmond Lodge No. 13 laid the cornerstone of what would become Masons' Hall. Still standing today, it is considered the oldest Masonic building in the United States continuously in use for that purpose.



October 29, 1787 – Charter Petition for Richmond Randolph Lodge No. 19 Just two years after the cornerstone was laid for Masons' Hall, a petition was filed for a charter for Richmond Randolph Lodge No. 19. This new lodge was a result of a schism with Richmond Lodge No. 13 and helped to further establish the Masonic community in Virginia.



**October 11, 1850 – Benicia Lodge No. 9 Instituted** While often cited as the date the building was opened, the more accurate historical event is that Benicia Lodge No. 9 was instituted on this date. The construction of a building for its use began in the summer of 1850.



October 14, 1850 – Occupancy of the Benicia Masonic Hall On this date, the Benicia Masonic Hall was first occupied by the lodge. The building, which is the first Masonic hall built in California, was formally dedicated later on December 27, 1850. It stands as a reminder of how quickly Masonry took root in California during the Gold Rush era and is preserved as a California state landmark.
